

STATEMENT: GLWA Response to EWG Report Tuesday, July 25, 2017

As new treatment techniques become available, the Authority will consider them as we continue to upgrade and invest in the regional system.

In addition to future investments, the Authority is also a proud participant of the Partnership for Safe Water, a program developed to guide water systems toward improving water quality by optimizing system operations. The Authority elected to participate in this program nearly a decade ago, and it has pushed us to go above and beyond regulatory standards.

The drinking water treatment process is a complex science and can vary greatly from state to state depending on source water. This is why we follow federal guidelines, which are formed with the diverse input of communities, clinicians, allied health professionals, environmental advocates, and other engaged stakeholders. It is these federal guidelines that help ensure that all Americans are receiving clean, safe water.
